Building a Healthier Future for CASA's Kids

You are truly a mental health hero! With your help, we are improving child, youth and family mental health in Alberta.

Helping More Kids in More Communities

In March 2023, the Government of Alberta pledged \$92 million to support CASA in delivering critical mental health services across the province. The province will provide \$25 million in capital funding over two years, along with \$37 million in operating funding over three years and an additional \$30 million for CASA Classrooms. With this investment, community-based services will expand to Calgary, Fort McMurray and central Alberta.

CASA House programs will be established in Calgary and Fort McMurray, bringing services closer to home for children, youth and families. In addition, our Adolescent Day Program will be integrated into CASA House locations so we can provide better care by offering step-up services to youth who need more support and step-down services for youth who are responding well to therapies.

The funding will also support the creation of mental health classrooms in schools across the province, where students with complex mental health challenges can be supported by an entire team of health professionals. Students will no longer have to

take time away from learning to travel for mental health care. Instead, their therapies will be integrated directly into their school day. The first wave of classrooms launched in February 2023 at two schools in the Sturgeon area, and classrooms will continue to expand throughout Alberta until 2025.


